Safety Precaution

**We appreciate your purchasing Megapixel IP PTZ camera.
Before installing the product, please read the following with care.**

- Make sure to turn off the power before installing camera.
- Do not install under the direct sunlight or in dusty areas.
- Make sure to use the product within the temperature and humidity specified in the specification.
- Do not operate the product in presence of vibrations or strong magnetic fields.
- Do not put electrically conducting materials in the ventilation hole.
- Do not open the top cover of the products. It may cause a failure or electric shock on the components.
- To prevent from overheating, make sure to keep the distance at least 10cm from the ventilation hole.
- Make sure proper voltage before connecting the power.

1. Introduction

About this manual

This User Manual provides information on operating and managing the megapixel IP PTZ camera. The Manual includes instructions of installation, operation and configuration of megapixel IP PTZ camera as well as how to make troubleshooting.

Features

This product is a megapixel PTZ network-based camera with remote live monitoring, audio monitoring and control via an IP network such as LAN, ADSL/VDSL, and Wireless LAN.

Video

- z Highly efficient compression algorithm, H.264 & MJPEG support

Powerful Pan/Tilt Functions

- z Max. 360°/sec high speed Pan/Tilt Motion
- z Using Vector Drive Technology, Pan/Tilt motions are accomplished in a shortest path. As a result, time to target view is reduced dramatically and the video on the monitor is very natural to watch.
- z For jog operation using a controller, since ultra slow speed 0.05°/sec can be reached, it is very easy to locate camera to desired target view. Additionally it is easy to move camera to a desired position with zoom-proportional pan/tilt movement.

Preset, Pattern, Swing, Group

- z MAX. 128 Presets are assignable and characteristics of each preset can be set up independently,
- z Max. 8 set of Swing action can be stored. This enables to move camera repetitively between two preset positions with designated speed.
- z Max. 4 of Patterns can be recorded and played back. This enables to move camera to follow any trajectory operated by joystick as closely as possible.
- z Max. 8 set of Group action can be stored. This enables to move camera repetitively with combination of Preset or Pattern or Swing. A Group is composed of max. 20 entities of Preset/Pattern/Swings.

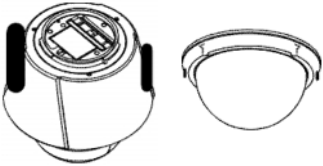
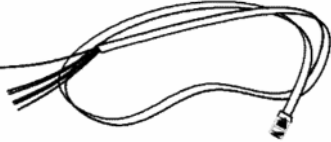
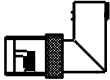
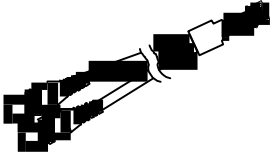
PTZ(Pan/Tilt/Zoom) Control

- z Pelco-D or Pelco-P protocol can be selected as a control protocol in the current version of firmware..

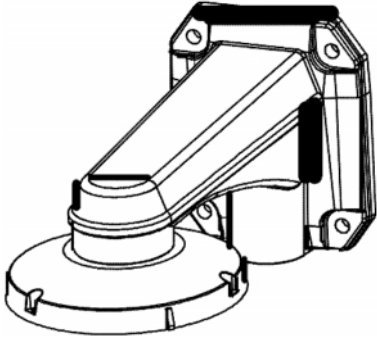
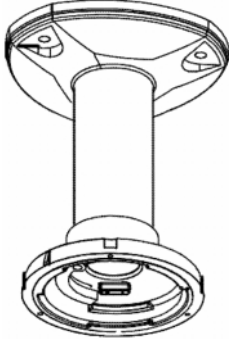

- z It is easy to install and maintain camera with terminal for cable connection in brackets.

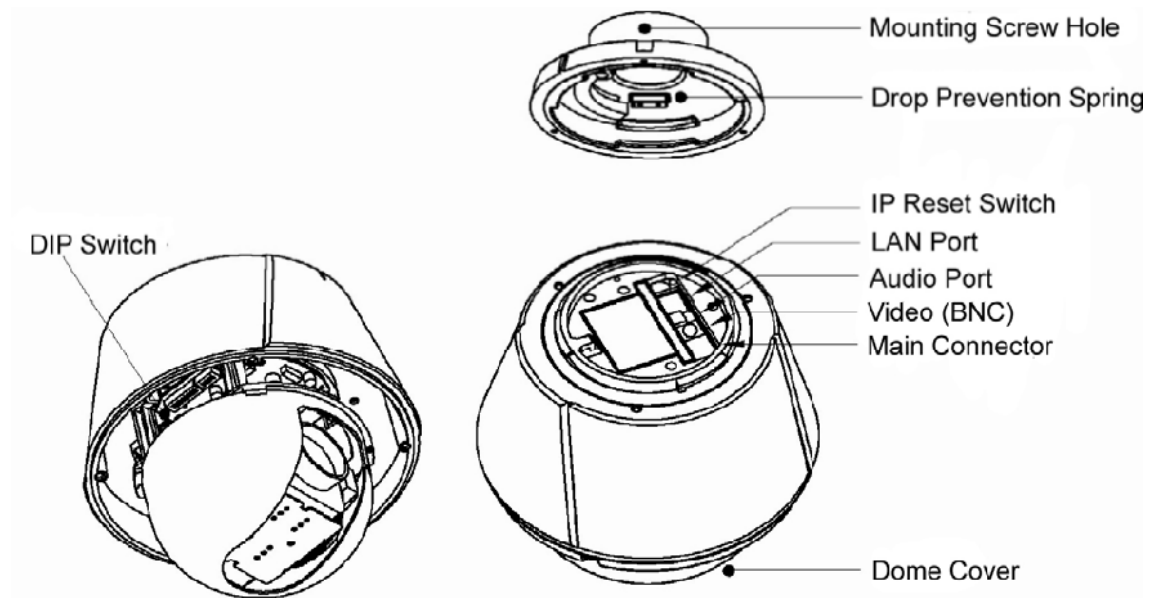

Part Names and Functions



- **Dome Cover** Do not detach protection vinyl from dome cover before finishing all installation process to protect dome cover from scratches or dust.
- **DIP Switch** Sets up camera ID and protocol.
- **Drop Prevention Spring** This part keeps the camera from dropping during installation and maintenance. After install the Bracket, please, hang the spring to the drop prevention hook of main body as shown in picture for further tasks.
- **Mounting Screw Hole** This hole is for screws that assembles the main body with a bracket.
- **IP Reset Switch** Reset its network configuration to the factory defaults. You will lose all data that had been entered previously. To initialize the system to the factory default, press the reset button for more than 5 seconds.
- **LAN Port** Used for the Ethernet connection
- **Audio Port** Used for the audio in/out connection.
- **Video (BNC)** Used for the composite video out or HD-SDI video out connection according to models
- **Main Connector** Used for the power wire, the RS-485 communication cable, alarm in/out connection cable.

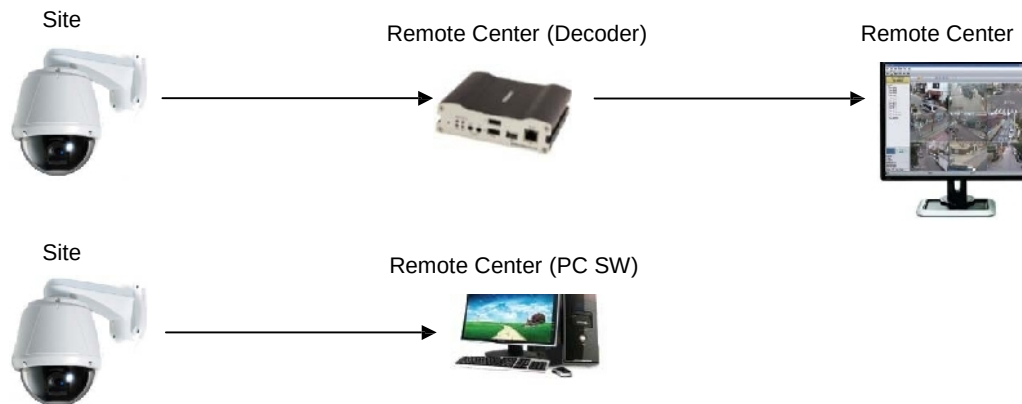
System Connections

IP Camera can be connected in either 1 to 1 connection where one camera is connected to one PC client or a decoder system or 1 to many connections where one camera can be connected to several PCs and decoder systems. (video server can work as a video decoder which takes the data from a video server or IP camera, decodes and outputs analog video.)

Topology

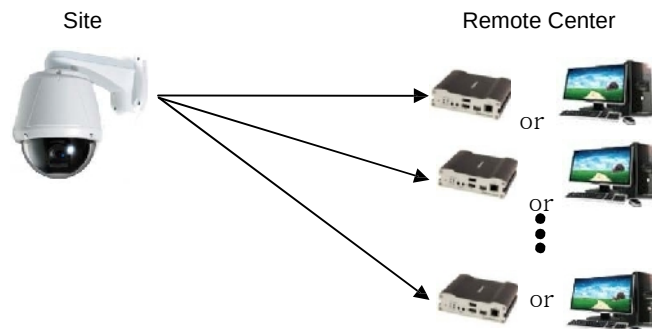
Generally, megapixel IP Camera and PC or a decoder is connected in 1-to-1 mode or 1-to many configurations.

z 1:1 Connection .



One camera is installed at a site where video images are transmitted. A PC or a decoder is installed at a central location to receive and view the video images on an analog monitor. Audio and serial data are transferred in either direction.

z 1:N Connection .



In this configuration, a site can be monitored from many remote central locations. Although up to 64 PCs or decoders can be connected to one camera, in the real network environment, network bandwidth can limit the maximum connections. Functionally, the central monitoring system (CMS) software provided can replace the decoder.

Multicast Mode

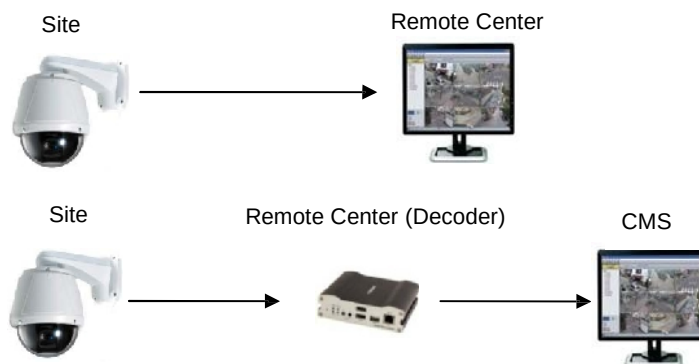
If the network supports multicasting, a large number of decoders can be used to receive video effectively from a camera using a single streaming of video and audio. However, multicast mode is possible only when network environment supports multicast.

Relay



Video and audio data can be retransmitted from a center to another center. The arrangement is useful when the network bandwidth to the site is limited while there are more than one center want to monitor the site.

VMS (Video Management System)

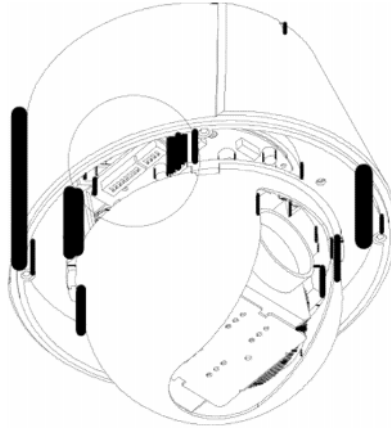


VMS (Central Monitoring System) is a Window-based remote monitoring program in order to monitor or control video, audio, and events in real time from several IP cameras or video servers. Please refer to the VMS User Manual for more in detail.

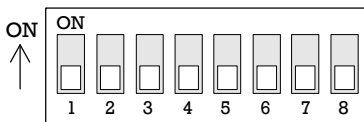
2. Installation

DIP Switch Setup

When you control the camera through RS-485, before installation, you should set the DIP switches to configure the camera ID, communication protocol.



Camera ID setup



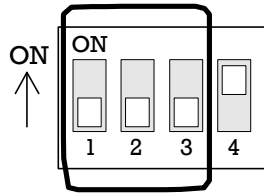
- z ID numbers of camera are set up with binary numbers..

See the examples shown below

- z The camera ID range is 1~255. **Camera ID must not be 0.**
- z **Factory default of Camera ID is 1.**
- z Match the camera ID with Cam ID setting of your DVR or Controller to control the camera.

- z Select the appropriate Protocol with DIP switch combination.

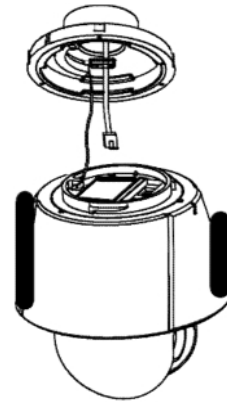
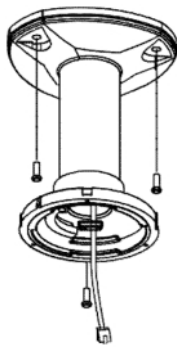

- z If you want to control using DVR or P/T controller, their protocol must be identical to camera. Otherwise, you can not control the camera.
- z Adjust the DIP switch after turning off the camera. If you changed the camera protocol by changing the DIP switch, the change will be effective after you reboot the camera.
- z **Factory default of protocol is “Pelco-D, 2400 bps”.**

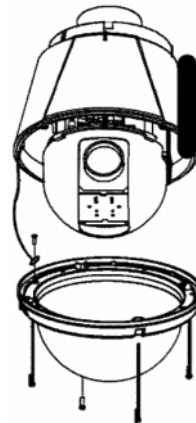
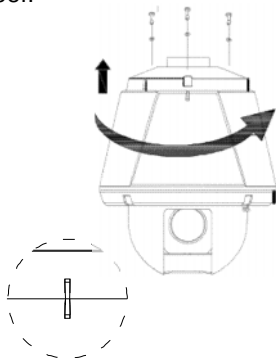
Installation Camera with Brackets

Installation using Ceiling Mount Bracket

- ① Remove the ceiling tile from the ceiling and cut a hole whose diameter is 30~40mm on the ceiling tile to pass the wire(s) and cable(s) through to the upside of the ceiling. (In case of the wiring and cabling through the mounting surface only) Then prepare the ceiling mount bracket. Pull the wire(s) for the system as below. (Anchor Bolt 3/8" × 70)
- ② Hook up "Drop Prevention Spring" on main body to prevent camera from unexpected drop and pull the wire(s) and cable(s) for the system as below



- ③ Line up the mold lines and assemble main body to mount adaptor and turn it. And assemble the main both with the camera mount adaptor with the screws. (Torx screw M4X18). Please make sure the screws are tightly assembled for waterproof.
- ④ Screw the dome cover to the main body and remove the protection vinyl from the dome cover.

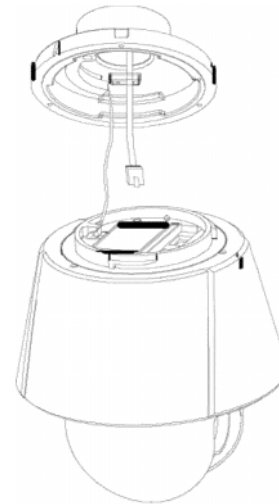
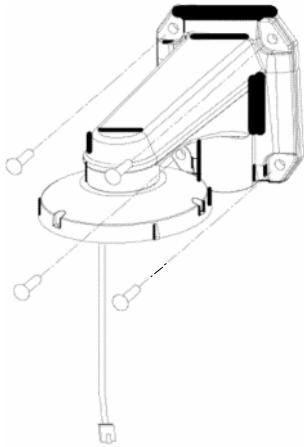

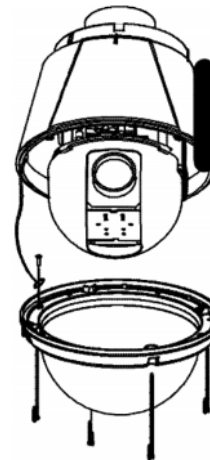
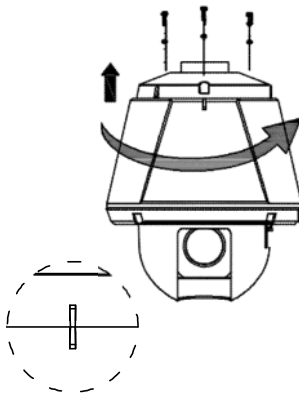
- z Before starting the installation, make sure that the Camera ID and Protocol are set up properly.
- z To adjust the installation height from the mounting surface, the pipe and coupler should be needed between the surface mount part of the ceiling mount bracket and the camera mount part of the ceiling mount bracket. Note that they are not supplied by the manufacturer.

Installation using Wall Mount Bracket

- ① Make a hole whose diameter is 30~40mm on the mounting surface to pass the wire(s) and cable(s) through the mounting surface. (In case of the wiring and cabling through the mounting surface only) Then prepare the wall mount bracket. Pull the wire(s) and cable(s) for the system as below. Attach the wall mount bracket to the mounting surface. (Hex Lag #14×50)
- ② Hook up "Drop Prevention Spring" on main body to prevent camera from unexpected drop and pull the wire(s) and cable(s) for the system as below.



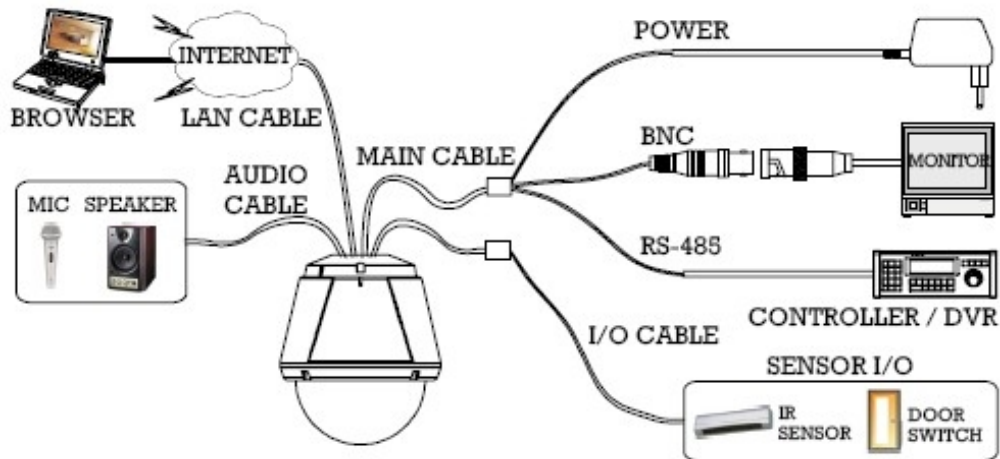
- ③ Line up the mold lines and assemble main body to mount adaptor and turn it. And assemble the main body both with the camera mount adaptor with the screws. (Torx screw M4X18). Please make sure the screws are tightly assembled for waterproof.
- ④ Screw the dome cover to the main body and remove the protection vinyl from the dome cover.

Connecting Power

1. Carefully check the voltage and current capacity of the rated power. The rated power is indicated in the back of main unit.
2. After confirming the power source, connect power adaptor and connect the 12V DC connector to the system
 - z For the DC input models, be careful with the polarity of DC power. The system should be permanently damaged by wrong DC input.
 - z In case that the length of the power wire is very long, there may be voltage drop and the system may not work properly. Make the length of the power wire as short as possible.

Connecting Network

1. Plug network cable to Ethernet port (RJ-45 network port).

Connecting Video

1. To display video through the composite or HD-SDI port, connect each port to a monitor using BNC coaxial cable
2. Set **Enable Preview** option “**ON**” on the Video tab of web page.

(Please refer to the Video Configuration part)

- z Especially in case of using HD-SDI, video cannot be viewed if BNC coaxial cable is not used.
- z In case that video transmission distance is long, video data may not be transmitted due to a reduction in the video signal. In order to prevent it, install a repeater in the middle.
- z In case of using HD-SDI, video can be viewed only on a HD-SDI monitor.

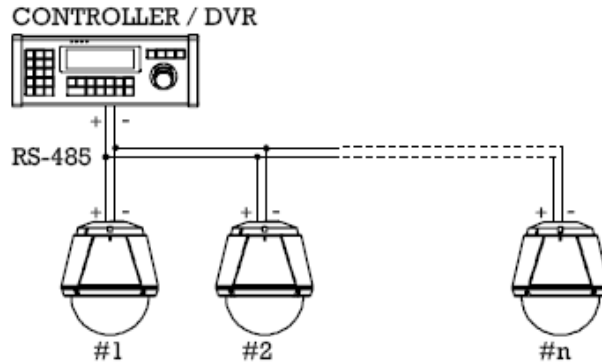
Connecting Audio

Audio is full-duplex. It is possible to set the mode as Tx-only, Rx-only or Tx-Rx.

1. Connect audio input and output ports to audio devices accordingly.
2. The Audio signal required is line level, so an audio equipment with an amp, mixer or other amplifier should be used.

Connecting Serial Port (RS-485 Communication)

- z For PTZ control, connect the cable(s) to your keyboard or DVR. To connect multiple cameras to a single controller, RS-485 communication should be connected in parallel as shown below. If you are connecting a single camera to a controller, terminate the camera. When connecting more than one camera to a single controller, terminate the last camera on the communication line. The last camera means the camera farthest in cable length from the controller. Note that the total length of the communication cable between a controller and the camera(s) on the same communication line must be less than 1.2Km.



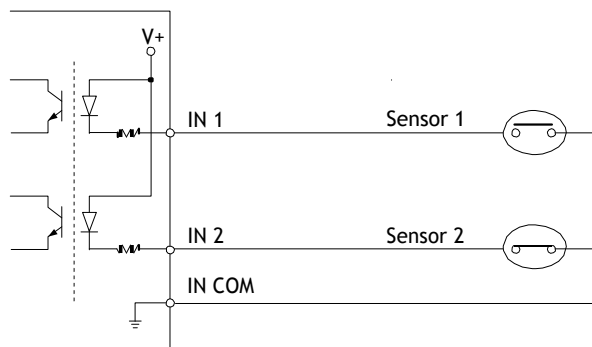
- z RS-485 of Megapixel PTZ Camera can be connected to external equipment such as PT receiver etc. PC client can send PT commands to the external equipment via the serial port.

When a decoder system instead of PC client is connected to Megapixel PTZ Camera, the serial port and that of the decoder system works in pass-through mode. That is, data from at one port is delivered to the other port, vice versa

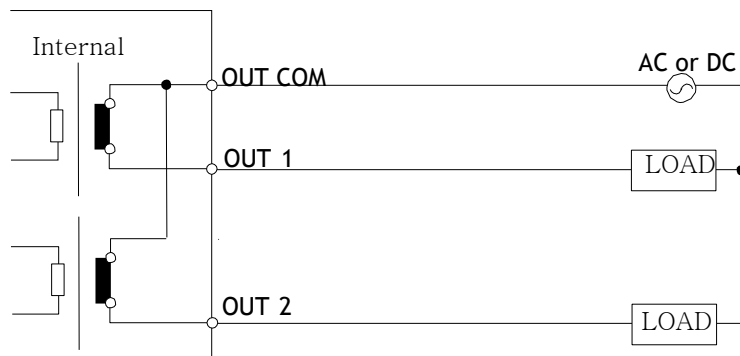
Connecting Sensor and Alarm

Connect sensor and alarm devices to corresponding terminals accordingly.

- z Sensor Input



z Relay Output



Maximum allowable electrical load of relay is shown bellow table.

Check if it works

Once the power is supplied to the camera, it will start booting. The system will boot up to an operating mode after approximately 40-60 seconds. The green LED on the Ethernet port will flash indicating the system is ready.

The software provided in the CD called True Manager allows you to check the IP address and other network details of the camera. Please refer to the True Manager manual for instructions on how to find the IP address of the camera and change it if required.

3. System Operation

Remote Video Monitoring

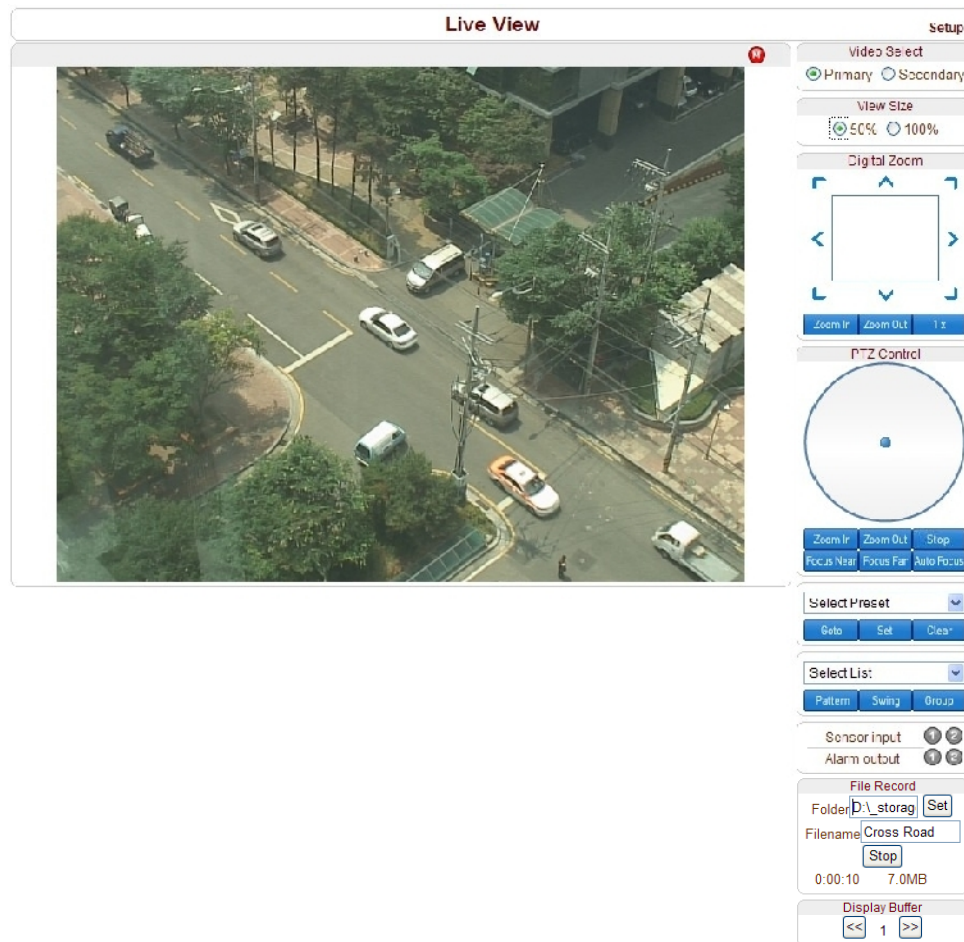
There are two ways to monitor video when the center system and Megapixel PTZ Camera are connected. In order for a proper operation, an IP address must be set accordingly. Please refer to **Manager in Chapter 3** or **Remote Setting in Chapter 4** for further details.

Video Monitoring using Internet Explorer

Open Internet Explorer and enter camera's IP address. The system will ask for confirmation to install Active-X control. Once authorized, the Internet Explorer will start to display video images from camera as shown below.

z Video Select

Select the Video stream to be viewed: Primary or Secondary

This camera is capable of dual streaming; primary streaming and secondary streaming.

Video will be displayed according to the resolution set on video configuration. If dual streaming ("**Use Dual Encode**" Menu in Video page) is not activated, secondary video is not available

z View Size

Adjust the Screen size

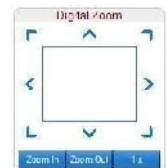
Screen size is initially adjusted according to the compression resolution. If you click 50% icon, the whole screen size will be reduced to half size.

z Digital Zoom

Control the Digital zoom on the screen

The more the camera zooms in, the smaller the square of control panel is. Position of the image can be changed by moving position of the square.

If you press **x1**, the screen will return to the normal size.



z PTZ Control (Optical Zoom & Digital zoom built-in the camera)

Control PTZ and PTZ Control Panel is used for controlling external PTZ devices when the external PTZ devices are connected through serial port.

It is possible to make zooming control by **Zoom in/out** buttons of PTZ control Panel (In order to use digital zoom, select **Digital zoom ON** in the **Camera** tab)



- Stop

Stop on-going PTZ action.

- Focus Near, Focus Far, Auto Focus

Adjust the focus of the lens

z Select Preset

Set preset position and move to the specific preset position.

- **Goto**: Move to the selected preset entry if the preset entry is set.
- **Set**: Set the current position to the selected preset entry.
- **Clear**: Delete the selected preset entry.

z Select List

Run a selected Pattern or Swing or Group.

After selecting an entry in the list, Pattern, Swing or Group button can be pressed. Then, corresponding operation is executed for the selected list.

(Please refer to the **PTZ tab** to set Pattern, Swing and Group)

z **Sensor Input**

Display the status of the sensor in real time.

This camera supports two sensor inputs. When the sensor of the camera is working, the sensor light turns red.

z **Alarm Output**

Operate the alarm device by pressing the number icon

This camera supports two alarm outputs. A number icon indicates status of the alarm device.

z **Snapshot**

Capture video images and store them as BMP or JPEG files.

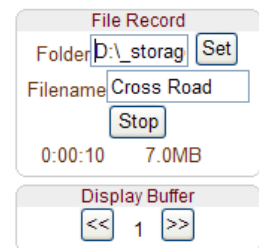
z **Talk**

Transfer audio from PC's mic to the camera.

z **File Record**

Recording to an AVI file on Live View page is available. AVI files are generated in the specified folder or in specified file name on the PC where web browser is running.

1. Press **"Set"** button to select folder or create a new folder. Enter the file name on Filename field.
2. Press **"Start"** button to start to record.
3. Press **"Stop"** button to stop to record.
4. AVI file named **"IP address_hh_mm_ss"** or **"File name_IP address_hh_mm_ss"** will be generated in the specified folder depending on whether the path specified a folder or a prefix of the file name.



z **Display Buffer**

Set the number of video frames to be buffered before being displayed on web browser. Larger value results in smoother video by sacrificing the latency. A setting of 10 ~ 15 frames can be used generally for most situations.

z **Other key function**

- Click to Center On-screen PTZ control

TCAM-570 series support "Click to center" as a function of on-screen PTZ control. By double clicking a position on the video area of web viewing, it is possible to move the clicked position to the center of the video area and zoom in.

Video Monitoring with Decoder System

Once camera's IP address is set in the remote IP address section of the decoder, the decoder system will connect to camera and start receiving the video images. Normally, a monitor connected to the decoder will display video images

Initialization of IP address

If a system IP address is lost, the system can be reset to the system default IP address using the reset button in the back side of the system.

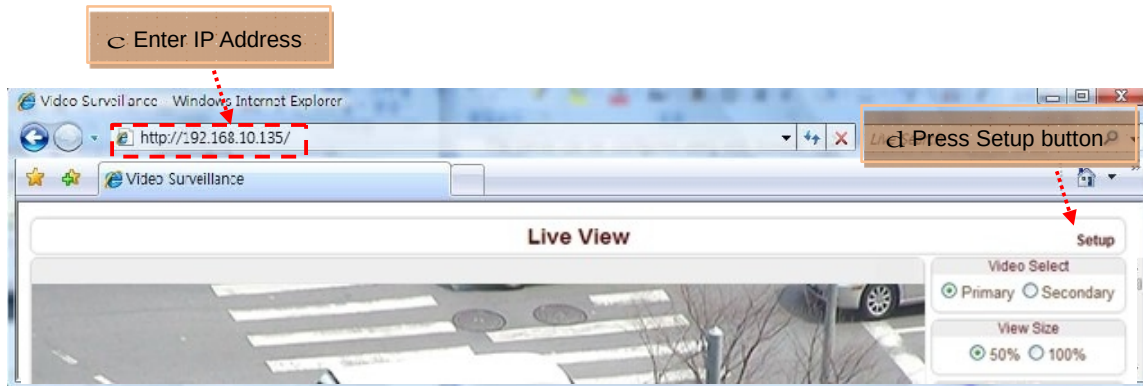
1. While system is in operation, press the reset button for more than 5 seconds.
2. The system will reboot automatically
3. Once the system reboots, IP address will be set to the system default as below.

4. Remote Configuration

Using Web Brower

Remote setting is available by using web browser. Enter IP address of camera and then a live view screen appears as below. Press **Setup** button located in the upper right area of the monitoring screen to go to the server setup. For Remote Setting, user should be authorized higher than manager level.



The configurations are grouped into 10 categories: **System, Video, Audio, Network, Serial, Event, PTZ, Record, User and Camera**. Any configuration changes are not applied until **Apply** button is pressed. Leaving the page without pressing **Apply** button, any changes in the page will be discarded.

z System ID

Enter System ID that is used as a camera title

The set System ID is displayed with video image on Web browser. The System ID is also transferred to remote software, such as VMS, and displayed on it.

z Burnin OSD System ID

Burnin OSD System ID specifies the string to be inserted into video image before encoding. Only alphanumeric and blank characters are allowed. Position and size can be configured on **Burnin OSD section** of Video page.

z Language

Select the language to be used for web-based configuration

Firmware

z Firmware version

Display the current firmware version

z Board ID

Display the Network board ID of the camera recognized by system

z Upgrade

Upgrade firmware

1. Press **Browse** button to select a firmware file from PC.
2. Press **Firmware Upgrade** button to start to upgrade.
3. Messages for showing status (downloading / upgrading) will be displayed.
4. The camera will reboot automatically after completing upgrade. **Do not turn the camera off during upgrading**

All the setting of configuration can be stored.

z Restore

Stored configuration can be browsed and restored. The server is rebooted once **Config Restore** button is pressed.

z Time Format

Change the time format. Selectable time formats are as below

z Time Zone

Select time zone of where the camera is installed.

Depending on the time zone, Daylight Saving Time will work automatically

A **time zone** is a region of the earth that has uniform standard time, usually referred to as the **local time**. By convention, time zones compute their local time as an offset from UTC (Coordinated Universal Time). In casual use, GMT (Greenwich Mean Time) can be considered equivalent to UTC. Local time is UTC plus the current time zone offset for the considered location

z **Automatically synchronize with NTP server**

Synchronize the camera time with an NTP server using NTP (network time protocol).

Name of the NTP server should be registered on NTP server Name.

The **Network Time Protocol (NTP)** is a protocol for synchronizing the clocks of computer systems over packet-switched, variable-latency data networks. It is designed particularly to resist the effects of variable latency by using a jitter buffer.

Reboot

- z Reboot the camera.

Do not press the Reboot button unless the server needs a reboot.

Factory Reset

- z All settings including user accounts and logs are cleared.

Factory Reset except network settings

- z All the settings except for current network settings are changed to default values.

Encode

z Enable Preview

1. Select **ON** to enable to display video on the monitor that is connected to the composite or HD-SDI video port.

2. Select the **Output format** accordingly in the end of the Video page.

Note that when **Enable Preview is ON**, dual streaming is not available.

When the video is transmitted directly to the monitor through BNC cable, the video does not go thorough network and encoding. Therefore, there is less delay and no an effect from network limitation.

z Resolution

Select video encoding resolution.

Scaling option is used when encoding resolution is different from input resolution. Without **Scaling** option, input video will be cut according to encoding resolution. On the other hand, if **Scaling** is selected, input video will be adjusted according to encoding resolution.

z Framerate

Determine the maximum number of frames per second for the video stream.

1,2,3,4,5,6,8,10,15,20,25 and 30 frame rate can be selected. The actual frame rate of video can be less than the maximum frame rate set due to the network bandwidth limitation

z Preference

Select encoding mode to control video quality or bitrate: Quality(VBR) or Bit rate(CBR).

If 'Bitrate' selected, the video encoding will be effected by the 'Bitrate' value entered. Therefore, "Bitrate" mode corresponds to CBR (Constant Bit rate) encoding.

If 'Quality' selected, the video encoding will be effected by the quality of image selected. Therefore, "Quality" mode corresponds to VBR (Variable Bit Rate) encoding.

z Quality

Select Video quality. 7 levels of quality are available.

Quality mode (VBR encoding) tries to encode every frame in a constant quality. Therefore, resulting bitrate may vary a lot depending on the complexity or activity changes in the input video. It is preferred when constant video quality is required and network bandwidth is enough for delivering the stream of highly varying bitrate.

z **Bit rate**

Determine bitrate value between 32 ~ 8000kbps.

Bitrate mode (CBR encoding) allows you to set a fixed target bitrate that consumes a predictable amount of bandwidth. In order to keep the bitrate limit, video quality is controlled dynamically according to the complexity or activity changes in the input video.

z **I-Frame Interval**

Determine I-frame Interval between 1 and 255.

z **H.264 Profile**

Select H.264 Profile: **High Profile** or **Baseline Profile**

The standard defines various sets of capabilities, which are referred to as profiles, targeting specific classes of applications.

z **High Profile (HiP)**

The primary profile for broadcast and disc storage applications, particularly for high-definition television applications (for example, this is the profile adopted by the Blu-ray Disc storage format and the DVB HDTV broadcast service).

z **Baseline Profile (BP)**

Primarily for low-cost applications that require additional data loss robustness, this profile is used in some videoconferencing and mobile applications. This profile includes all features that are supported in the Constrained Baseline Profile, plus three additional features that can be used for loss robustness (or for other purposes such as low-delay multi-point video stream compositing).

Dual Encode

z **Use Dual Encode**

1. Select **Off** button on the **Enable Preview** to enable to use Dual Encode
2. Select **ON** to enable to use Dual Encoding

The secondary video can be viewed on **Live View** window by selecting **Secondary** on **Video selection**

In case of H.264, either Bitrate mode or Quality mode can be selected for Preference mode in. On the other hand, MJPEG supports **Quality** mode only.

Sensitivity is the condition to trigger an event of motion detection.

The value determines the sensitivity of the motion detection within a block: the smaller, the more sensitive. It is selectable from 0 to 10.

Information Display

System ID and/or server time can be display over the video window in Internet Explorer. Each item can be turn on or off separately, and position also can be configured. This information is displayed **after the video is decompressed**.

BurnIn OSD

Insert system ID and date/time **in the compressed video**. System ID and time respectively can be turned on or off in the video. Position and Font size can be configured also. System ID for BurnIn OSD exists independently from normal System ID.

Note that size of Burnin OSD display varies according to the encoding resolution setting. This is inevitable because Burnin OSD is inserted to the frames before encoding is performed. The following table describes the rule for BurnIn OSD display.

One-way Streaming

Transport Stream is specified in MPEG-2 Part 1, Systems (formally known as ISO/IEC standard 13818-1 or ITU-T Rec. H.222.0). Transport stream specifies a container format encapsulating packetized elementary streams, with error correction and stream synchronization features for maintaining transmission integrity when the signal is degraded. As MPEG-TS itself supports only AAC as the audio algorithm, only video is streamed when audio algorithm is set to G.711.

- z **Vdyn:** Vdyn is a DDNS service provided by Visionica (<http://visionica.com>). No further configuration is required for using this service. It internally uses MAC address for the registration. When it succeeds, the domain name of the form 001C63A607EC.visionica.info is displayed on CurrentDomain entry of Network page. E-mail setting is not mandatory.

- z **Check IP Disable:** If “Check IP Disable” is selected, it will skip to check its own IP. In Fixed IP mode, the set IP will be registered on DDNS server. In DHCP mode, dynamically assigned IP will be registered on DDNS server. Normally **Check IP Disable** should be unchecked in order to obtain public IP in the network.

Bitrate control

When there are more than one client connected to the camera, due to bandwidth difference among the clients some of them do not have enough bandwidth to receive encoded stream completely. In this case, it is possible to select the way to stream video to clients as following.

- z **Frame Drop Mode:** Encoding is performed strictly according to video settings. When a client is connected through a network with less bandwidth, it may not receive all the frames. That is, frames are dropped on sending module if the network is bottlenecked.
- z **Suppression Mode:** Encoding bitrate and frame rate are adjusted not to drop any frames when the network bandwidths to some clients are limited. In this case, all clients can be affected by the averaged bitrate and frame rate.

This camera has two sensor ports and two alarm ports.

When a decoder instead of a PC client is connected to camera, one system becomes a Local system and the other a Remote system (Generally a system which is being used by the user is called as Local system). Then, actions for events can be configured for events from the remote system as well as for local system. For example, it is possible to turn on an alarm device in local (center) decoder system when a sensor device in remote (site) IP camera is triggered. **Local** section configures the actions for events from local (self) system, and configuration activates local devices and **Remote** sections configure the actions for events from remote (peer) system.

PTZ

- z Circular plate provides panning and tilting functions combined with speed control. Clicking a mouse on a position of the circular plate determines the speed of the control as well as the direction.

Mask

- z Masks can be displayed in the video.
- 1. Position camera and select one of Masks from drop down menu.
- 2. Press New button to get a mask and adjust mask size with the size buttons .
- 3. The specified mark can be shown by Search button.

Preset

- z Max 128 preset positions can be defined.
- z **Select Preset Number:** Select an entry in the list to be assigned to current camera position.
- z **Focus Mode:** Select the focus mode after preset Go to is executed.
 - Do not change:** current focus mode is not changed.
 - Force Auto:** auto-focusing is executed after the preset moved.
 - Force Manual:** move to the focus position saved when preset set.
- z **Event Holding Time:** Set the time to stay at the pre set position when the preset moved by event.
 - If it is set to 0, the camera doesn't return to original position after moving to the pre set position by event.
- z **Edit Label:** Assign a label to the pre set position. Only the first 15 preset entries (Preset-1 ~ Preset-15) can have labels.

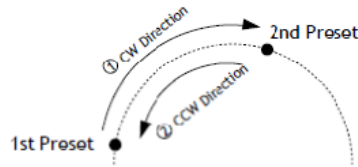
Pattern

- z Pattern is a function that the camera memorizes the path (mostly curve path) by joystick of controller for assigned time and revives the path exactly as it memorized. 4 patterns can be defined and max 760 communication commands can be stored in a pattern.
 1. Select one of the entries in **Select Pattern Number** list
 2. Press **Set Pattern Start** button. Form the pattern by controlling PTZ. Every path will be saved until pressing **Set Pattern Stop** button
 3. Press **Set Pattern Stop** button to save the pattern
 4. Press **Run Pattern** button to run the selected pattern

Notice: When the camera memorizes patterns, not the positions of pan/tilt/zoom but the commands are stored in the memory. Hence there might be small differences between the original path visited on forming the pattern and the revived path on running the pattern.

Swing

- z By using swing function, you can make camera to move between 2 preset positions repeatedly. When swing function runs, camera moves from the preset assigned as the 1st point to the preset assigned as the 2nd point in CW(Clockwise) direction. Then camera moves from the preset assigned as the 2nd point to the preset assigned as the 1st point in CCW(Counterclockwise) direction.

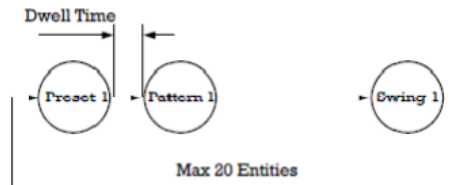


In case the preset assigned as the 1st point is same as the preset assigned as the 2nd point, camera turns on its axis by 360° in CW(Clockwise) direction and then it turns on its axis by 360° in CCW(Counterclockwise) direction.

1. Check **Enable** box
2. Select the Preset for **1st Position** and **2nd Position**
3. Enter the **Speed** (0~255)
4. Press **Save Swing** button to save the Swing

Group

- z This function is that the camera memorizes the combination of Presets, Pattern and/or Swings sequentially and runs Presets, Pattern and/or Swings repetitively on activation. Max 8 groups are programmable. Each group can have max 20 actions which are the combinations of Preset, Pattern and Swing. **Option** field has different meanings for Preset and Pattern/Swing. For Preset, it configures the preset speed. For Pattern/Swing, it configures the number of repetition. Dwell time between actions can be set up as well.



1. Select one of the entries of Group
2. Press **Modify Group** button. The following window will appear.
3. Set **Action(Preset or Swing or Pattern)**, **Dwell Time** and **Option** and click **Enable** squares
4. Press **Apply** button and the Group can be used on the **Live View Page**

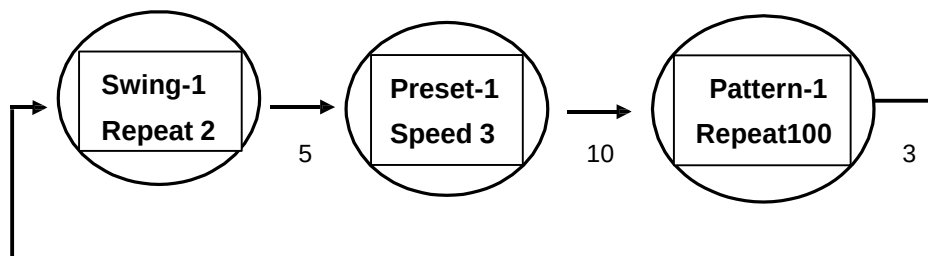

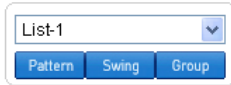

Auto Parking

Auto parking is a function to return to the previous preset position or to resume operation such as Pattern, Swing or Group when a specified time expires after user stopped PTZ control. **Parking time** can be set from 0 to 3600 seconds and "0" means that **Auto Parking** function is turned off.

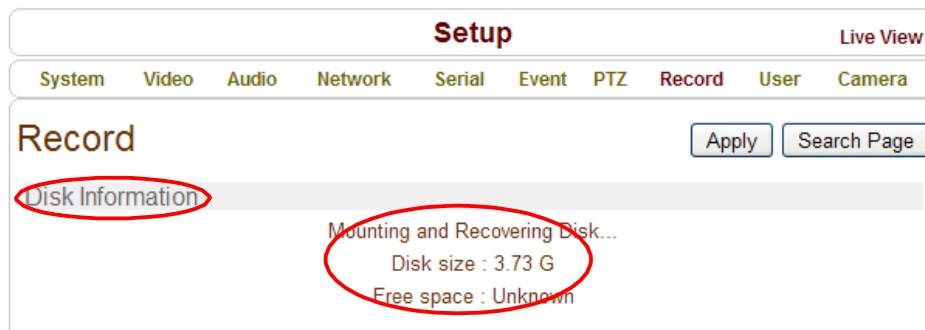
DISK

SD memory can be used, and at least 1GB size is recommended. Either EXT3 or FAT32 file system can be used. A disk with either EXT3 or FAT32 file system can be read in Linux PC. However, only disk with FAT32 file system can be read in Windows PC.

Less than 4Mbps of video bit rate is recommended when you record and monitor video simultaneously since frame dropping may happen due to performance limitation.

Disk information

Be sure to restart the system after connecting an SD card. During booting, the system reads status of disk and initializes it. Once the initialization of a disk is finished, the status of disk is shown on **Record** page of web-based setup.



Refer to the chart for checking the status of disk.

Disk error detected	Error
No disk	Disk is not connected to the system.
Searching Disk information	Checking the status of disk. Refresh the page and wait until the status is changed.

General

z Use record

- **Off**: Recording function will not be used when “**Off**” is selected
- **Use Disk**: Recording will be enabled and data will be written to a disk
- **Use FTP**: Recording will be enabled and data will be uploaded to an FTP server. In this mode FTP upload by event is automatically disabled.

z Select Video

Select video stream to record.

z Manual Record

When ON is selected, record is operated regardless of schedule.

z Overwrite

When the disk becomes full, the oldest data are deleted automatically. It is valid only when **Use Record** is set to **Use Disk**.

z Max File Size/Max File Length

Max File Size option is for limiting the size of AVI file. If small file size is set, files of small size will be generated but numbers of the files will be increased. **Max File Length** option is for limiting the time length of AVI file. If the size of a file becomes **Max File Size** or the duration of the recording reaches **Max File Length**, a new file is created.

z Automatically Backup to FTP

Data recorded in the disk can be uploaded to an FTP server automatically for backup. FTP server is configured on Event page. It is valid only when **Use Record** is set to **Use Disk**.

z Erase After Backup

Data are deleted in the disk automatically after being uploaded to the FTP server. It is valid only when **Automatically Backup to FTP** is used.

z Start Time of Backup Data

Specify the time of the data in the disk from which Backup to FTP Disk is performed. This time is changed automatically as the backup to FTP server goes. So it is useful to check current backup status. It is valid only when **Automatically Backup to FTP** is used.

z FTP Base Directory

Specify the name of the directory to be created in the FTP server. It is valid only when **Use Record** is set to **Use FTP**.

Event Type

Three recording modes are supported: **Continuous**, **Event**, **Disconnect**. In case of Event recording, event types can be selected among several events. Selected event type is used for configuring the schedule table. Up to 4 event types can be configured and each event type can be a combination of sensor, video loss and motion event.

z **Pre-event Time**: Specify the duration of recording before an event happens.

z **Post-event Time**: Specify the duration after the event is cleared.

Schedule Table

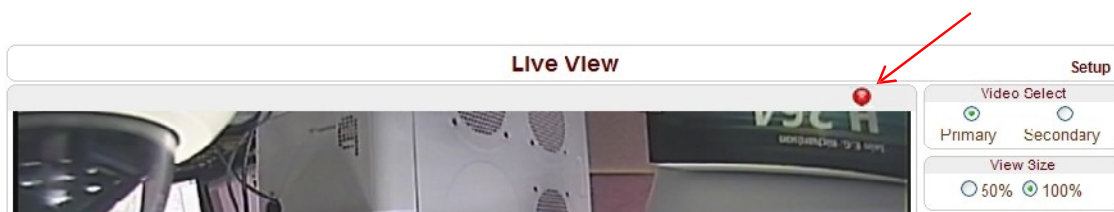
Actual recording mode is determined by **Schedule Table**, where recording mode configured by day (of a week) and hour.

Each of recording mode configures the recording operation as follows:

- **Record off** : No recording
- **Continuous**: Records continuously
- **Disconnect**: Recording is started when the system loses the connection to its last client(Decoder, VMS/NVR) etc. When there are multiple clients and one of the client is disconnected, this doesn't happen.
- **Event Type**: Records when an event configured in **Event Type** setting happens.

Checking status of recording

Recording status can be checked on the main view page.



Search and Playback

Recorded video and audio data can be saved as AVI format in the disk. In general, one AVI file is created for an event in case of event-based recording. However, it is possible that recorded data by series of events happening continuously can be merged to a single AVI file depending on pre/post event time setting. The size of file is limited to 10 ~ 200MB or 10 minutes. In case of continuous recording, AVI files are created in series and the size of each is limited to 10 ~ 200MB or 10 minutes.

Search

Actual recording a file currently being recorded doesn't appear until it is completed. In case of Continuous recording, a file will be shown after 10 minutes from the start of recording, for a file is generated every 10 minutes.

1. Press **Search Page** button on the **Record** setup page. Dates with recording data will be shown as follows.



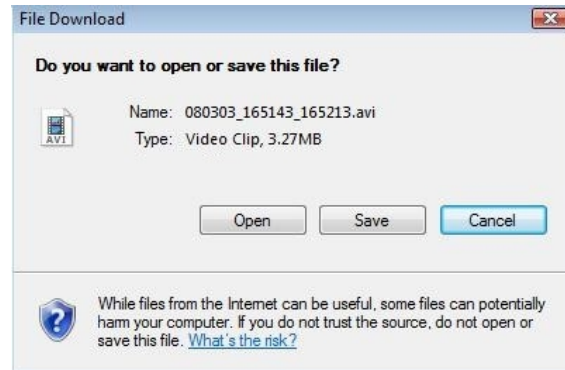
2. First, choose the date for search and the list of AVI files will be shown.
3. The file name shows the date and time: "**Date Begin Time End Time.avi**".



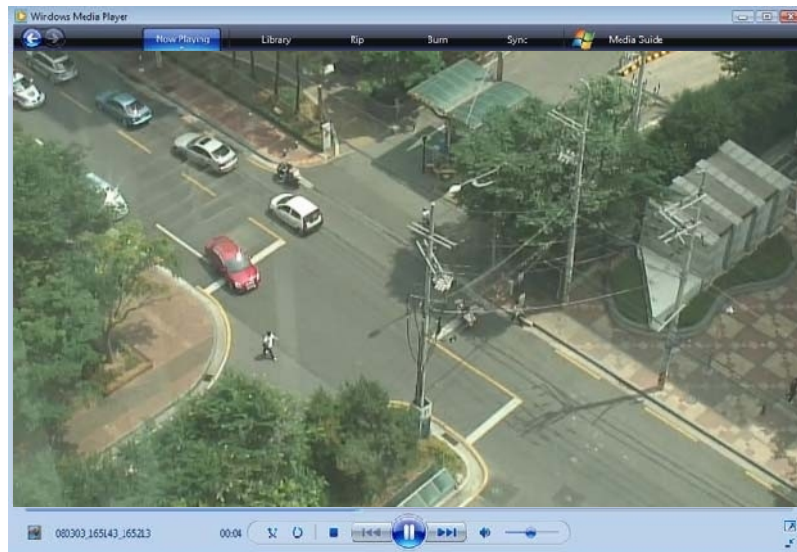
4. Press **Root** to move back to the page with date list.

z Playback

1. Selecting an AVI file will show a dialog for opening or saving the file.



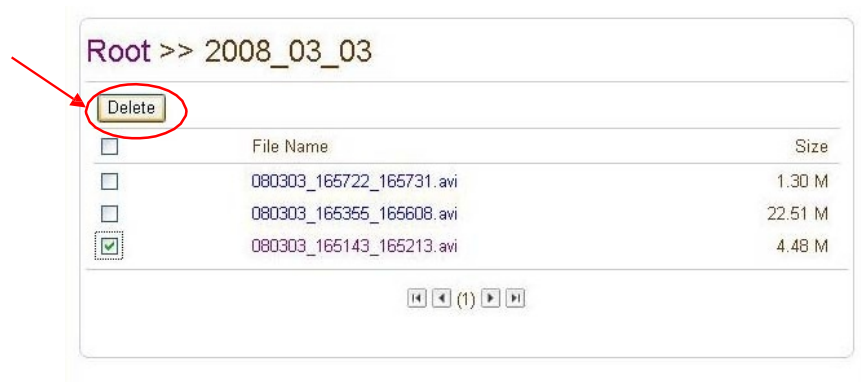
2. Pressing **Save** button, the file will be stored in the PC. The AVI file can be played with Windows Media Player.



3. If you press **Open** in the dialog, the file will be downloaded and played automatically with Media Player.
4. Another connection through web is disabled during downloading and it is also not allowed to download two AVI files at the same time.

z Deletion of data

1. If you want to delete recorded files, select the files by checking the item in front of each file and press **Delete** button.



2. It is possible to delete multiple files at once.

User Configuration

Day & Night

The camera delivers color images during the day. As light diminishes below a certain level, the camera can automatically switch to night mode (Black & White mode) to maintain good image quality.

- z **Day & Night Mode** can be selectable according to environment.
- z **Auto** : Automatically switches to Day (Color) or Night(B&W) according to light using ICR (Infrared Cut filter Removable)
- z **Day (Color)** : Deliver color image regardless of light.
- z **Night (B/W)** : Deliver B/W image regardless of light

White Balance

- z White Balance has the following modes.
- z **Auto**: This mode computes the white balance value output using color information from the entire screen. It outputs the proper value using the color temperature radiating from a black subject based on a range of values from 3000 to 7500K
- z **Manual**: Manual control of R and B gain, 256 steps each.
- z **Indoor** : 3200K Base Mode
- z **Outdoor** : 5800 K Base Mode

Auto Exposure

- z **AE Mode**
- z **Full Auto**: Auto Iris and Gain, Fixed Shutter Speed (59.94/NTSC:1/60 sec, 50/PAL: 1/50 sec)
DSS (Digital Shutter Speed) mode (Auto or Off) can be selected. When DSS mode is Auto, from 1/2 to 1/60 **DSS Limit** is available. **Back Light Compensation** can be selected.
- z **Manual**: 21 steps of Shutter, 18 steps of Iris and 8 steps of Gain can be set manually.
- z **Shutter Priority**: 21 steps (1/2 ~ 1/10,000) of Shutter Speed can be set manually. The Iris and Gain are set automatically, according to the brightness of the subject.
- z **Iris Priority**: 18 steps (F1.8 to Close) of Iris can be set manually. The Shutter Speed and Gain are set automatically, according to the brightness of the subject.
- z **Bright**: The bright control function adjusts both the Gain and Iris using an internal algorithm according to a brightness level freely set by user. Exposure is controlled by Gain when dark and by iris when bright. As both Gain and Iris are fixed, this mode is used when exposing at a fixed camera sensitivity.
- z **Spot Light**: Avoids a situation where the face of the subject is over-illuminated, and becomes whitish. In Spot AE, a particular section of the subject can be designated, and then that portion of the image can be weighted and a value computed so that Iris and Gain can be optimized to obtain an image..
- z **DSS Mode**
Select **Auto** to operate DSS (Digital Sutter Speed)

z **Back Light Compensation**

It is an ability of a camera to balance the lighting in a scene with an extremely bright background such as sunlight. It helps to obtain the finest light contrast and get clear image.

ETC

z **Digital Zoom**

Determine to use Digital zoom (12x) supported by the camera zoom lens.
x10 Optical zoom and x12 Digital zoom lens

z **Aperture Level**

Set Aperture Level from 0 to 15

Aperture control is a function which adjusts the enhancement of the edges of objects in the picture. There are 16 levels of adjustment, starting from "no enhancement." When shooting text, this control may help by making the text sharper.

z **WDR**

Select **On** to enable WDR (Wide Dynamic Range) function.

z **Image Flip**

Select **On** to enable image to be shown flipped.

z **Mirror**

Select **On** to enable image to be shown mirrored.

z **Noise Reduction**

Select proper level of step from drop down menu for noise reduction.

z **Freeze on Position Move**

During PTZ operating, stopped video before PTZ operating is showing on the display. Once PTZ operation is stopped, video is changed to the current position.

z **Zoom Proportional Jog**

When Zoom proportional Jog is ON, Pan/Tilt speed can be set automatically after Zoom in (x10)

z **Auto Flip**

z **ON:** In case that tilt angle arrives at the top of tilt orbit(90°), zoom module camera turns on its axis by 180° at the top of tilt orbit and moves to opposite tilt direction (180°) to keep tracing targets.

z **OFF:** More than 90° tilt moving is not available

z **Max Jog Speed**

Adjust Max Pan Speed (8 Steps)

z **Max Zoom Speed**

Adjust Max Zoom Speed (8 Steps)

z **Display PTZ Action**

PTZ control action such as Preset Goto, Pattern, Swing or Group can be displayed on the top of live display. As the information is displayed with burn-in OSD, it is inserted into encoded stream and all clients see the information.

z **Auto:** The information is displayed only for several seconds after a specific operation.

z **ON:** The information is displayed always.



☞ If BurnIn OSD is enabled for system ID and/or time, BurnIn OSD items disappears while PTZ action is displayed. In other words, BurnIn OSD information and PTZ action don't come simultaneously.

z **Power Up Action**

Specify if the camera will continue previous action such as pattern, swing or group after it is rebooted by power.

z **ON:** If pattern, swing or group was running before rebooting, the action is resumed. If it was in stopped state, it moves to the last position.

z **OFF:** Moves to the initial position after rebooting.

Scheduling Configurations

In order to allow different configurations of the camera according to time of a day, the feature of defining camera configurations and scheduling them is provided..

z Configuration Set

4 different configuration sets can be configured by opening the page with **Config Set#N** buttons. For example, Config Set#1 can be configured for day mode, and Config Set#2 can be configured for night mode.

z Scheduling of the configurations

Cells in the weekly/hourly schedule table can be set to appropriate configurations by clicking a specific cell or a cell for hour or a cell for a day of a week.
